2024/25 Budget Review at a glance


- \$51.1 million capital works program, supported by \$48.3 million in State and Commonwealth grants
- \$82.7 million operational spending, partially funded by \$37.5 million in own source revenue and \$43.8 million in operational grants
- \$1.4 million operating deficit

Council's operational revenue


- Council will utilise a combination of fees & charges, contract & recoverable works, rental income, commercial property (own source revenue) and operational grants to fund the budget.
- The majority of funding is provided through State and Federal grants - similar to other indigenous councils in Queensland who cannot draw on rateable revenue.

Short-term considerations

- The Budget Review has been delivered amidst rising costs, reduced revenue, high inflation, and supply chain challenges.
- Despite these challenges, Council remains committed to delivering essential services and supporting our communities while minimising the financial burden on residents.
- Maintaining financial sustainability is important for Council. Short-term actions to enable this include:
 - Increasing advocacy and liaison with State and Commonwealth agencies.
 - · Sourcing additional funding opportunities.
 - Exploring opportunities to deliver both cost efficiencies and enhance revenue making activities.
 - Identifying and improving business practices.
 - Evaluating and understanding the cost impacts of services that fall outside of the core services provided by Council.
 - Enhancing Council's approach to capital governance, planning and investment.





Longer-term considerations

- Council will continue to focus on improving its financial sustainability.
- A continued focus area will be longer term planning, ensuring that the infrastructure and services provided by Council align with community needs.
